Presentation of Monthly Stats-32nd Pct. NCO Sergeant

NCO Sgt. Figuereo-Our Pct. Is slightly up in overall crime by 27%. No murders or rapes in this 28-day period. Robberies are down by 20%, Felony Assaults are up by 45%, Burglaries are up 47%, Larceny is up 60%, and Grand Larceny Auto remained the same.

Questions

- Michele Linton-There have been a lot of shootings and gang related activity on 148th street along Adam Clayton Powell Blvd., Bradhurst & Edgecombe. Specifically on Saturday nights and with young people.
 - Answers-We have 4 patrol cars dedicated to patrolling the area from 7pm to midnight. This night team is working closely with the NYPD gang unit and narcotics. We share files and information. In addition, As Apostle Ramos mentioned, we also work with cure violence organizations as well.
- Nat Artman- On Bradhusrt and 145th street, I notice that people are running stop signs which is dangerous because there are a lot of children in the area. This may be due to people blocking the cross walks where pedestrians should walk. Answers-Taking note of this occurrence and working in conjunction with traffic officers to see what can be done.

Presentation of Monthly Stats-28th Pct. Captain Michael Butler

- Capt. Butler-The Pct. Is down overall by 7%. No murders and no rapes in this 28-day period. No changes in robberies. Down overall by 7% No murders, No Rapes, Same as last year with robberies. There has been a drop of 21% in felony assault. Burglaries increased (one individual with this reoccurring crime. Apprehended by the safety team. He has been in custody and released but now we know who we are looking for.) Down in Grand Larceny and Grand Auto Larceny.
- The two shootings that occurred one on April 23 rd, 2022, on 112th Street and another on April 26th, 2022, that occurred at Kings Houses but is still under investigation.
- Please take your keys out of your car it only takes one minute to get your car stolen.
- Thursday is the highest day of the week that crime occurs

Ouestions

- Lady Moore- Do the patrol officers work with the transit officers? I notice that there are officers on the subway which reduces crime but once they leave the crime restarts. In addition, are there officers checking that people pay their fairs? Will there be officers checking fairs like they used to?
 - Yes, our patrol officers will pop into the subways and patrol the areas and we work with the Transit District 3 officers who are assigned to this location. The questions about the fairs would be better answered by TD3. At this time there are no plans to have officers check the fairs of the riders.

- Shawn Brannon-CB10-There is an issue with crime near the Scaffolding on 116th street and Adam Clayton Powell near Graham court. When I walk the near the bus stop and across the street at the park it is an "Active" Location with a lot of issues.
 - Yes, we are aware of the increase of activity near the scaffolding and have more patrol sent out in these areas. We notice that addressing traffic concerns also helps with these issues, so we are addressing this as well. - Lady Moore, YOURS- Regarding Sex Trafficking-We tell our young people that we have mental health resources and help but I don't see this. I have a young woman who is need of immediate help. We have been to various organizations, but no one is providing the immediate clinical- and Psychiatric (medical) assistance we need.
 - Response by Tracy-SCR, we have many programs, I can reach out- we have after school activities and we speak to them often and help them get jobs, apply for college, and anything they need help with. We don't want them to feel alone. They are our future. In addition, we do have Mental Health Counselors.
 - Lady Moore- What about after 18? No one is there to help them after they age out.
 - Response by Tracy-We don't have a Gap on the ages in which we serve. We help those over 18 years old with: Education, jobs, living situations, whatever is needed. Please reach out for One-onOne resources for this particular person. We will help her.

- Apostle Ramos- Clergy/Community Members are heading down to Buffalo to support the efforts of "Boots on the Ground" needs such as Pastoral Care.
