MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 pm by Committee Co-Chair Barbara Nelson, followed by welcoming remarks and introductions of CB 10 Chair Marquis Harrison, committee members and DOT Kyle Gorman and Lyle Blackwood.

Commissioner Car Share postponement requested, no response from letter sent to DOT requesting further exploration and use of metered spaces.

A. Follow Up Question to DOT referencing sent letter in January asking DOT to postpone the Car Share Program and discussion on the proposed spaces utilized be of the metered spaces not the local spaces. CB 10 has not received a response, requesting follow up. Lyle Blackwood DOT will follow up and get back to the board and committee regarding the lack of response from DOT Lyle Blackwood, "the program will be moving forward". Committee questioned the disrespect to the community; lack of community involvement. Question to District Manager Shatic Mitchell to follow up with other CBs regarding community involvement of proposals by DOT prior to implementation within the communities.

B. Open Streets Application Review

1. Frederick Douglass Blvd from W.112th Street to West 120th Street: Presenter John Lynch reported Change of hours: Saturdays 10 AM until 10PM and Sundays 10 AM until 9 PM More barriers will be allotted and MTA outreach and notices to be provided to the community regarding Bus Route changes. 117th Street and 118th Street will be open providing access to the Senior Residence Suggested outreach to Arts and Cultures for partnership **Vote / Unanimous approval**

2. West 120th Street from Lenox Avenue to Mt. Morris Park West: Extensive discussion regarding; selection and criteria for Limited Local Access closure, notice of activities provided post pandemic for 7 days a week from 10 AM to 8 PM Sunday thru Thursday and Friday and Saturday 10 AM to 10 PM throughout the year, outreach to the community, local parking, appropriate signage identifying availability by Maintenance Partner Marcus meets Malcolm and DOT to brainstorm signage options. **Vote / Passed** 4 for and 2 against / 1 recusal

3. West 142nd Street from 5th Avenue to Chisum Place: Direct access to FDR drive, DOT to follow up with exploring the impact of this proposed Open Streets Application and inform CB10 THPL committee with results or alternative street location. **Review and Return / No Vote**

4. West 128th Street from Frederick Douglass Blvd. to St. Nicholas Avenue: Closed from July 4th thru August 30th on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10 AM thru 5 PM. **Vote / Unanimous approval**

C. Traffic Congestion & Double Parking on 125th Street- Barbara Askins Pilot Program to address parking and congestion incorporating technology. An RFP to be submitted 3/17/23. Concerns with using AI artificial intelligence in monitoring, by whom and how will the data be utilized with the installation of smart sensors in collaboration with city agencies; DOT, NYPD the Research Center of Columbia University and SIPA the School of International Public Administration. **Vote Failed / Not enough information**

D. Dedicated Parking Lane for Properly Registered Motorcycles- Tyrone Thomas

5. Pilot program suggested in request of public parking on the Streets for Motorcycles. Requested 137th Street between Malcom X and Adam Clayton Powell south east corner. Reported damages to cycles parked with cars and ticketing for parking on the sidewalks ongoing, seeking pilot program as a resolution for Motorcycle owners licensed and registered bikes only. DOT agreed to follow up with additional information regarding a pilot program.
