Their purpose is to "address inequities in socioeconomically disadvantaged neighborhoods over the summer". Brandon and Karim are both graduates of the NYC public school system. After attending college they have decided to attempt to fill some of what is missing in the classrooms with summer study. Their program pairs skill development for younger students with leadership development, career training and college prep for older students. Practice Makes perfect has three areas of development, Summer Enrichment for Struggling Learners, Leadership, Career Development and College Prep for High Achieving Learners and Professional Experience and Teaching Exposure in High-Need Environments. They are currently working with several Charter School summer programs and are hoping to branch out to manage more public school summer programs.
