Since 1984, the Safe Horizon's Streetwork program have worked with homeless and street-involved youth in New York City to provide them with opportunities to achieve stability; reduce unhealthy behaviors, and ensure their health through a range of practical and supportive services. Streetwork's mission is to offer homeless, runaway and street-involved youth respite from hunger, cold, loneliness and fear and the opportunity to reclaim a sense of dignity and self-worth. The core service is long-term one-on-one counseling, which is offered in a non-judgmental and holistic manner. Additionally, services such as meals, groups, legal, medical and mental health services, and HIV testing are offered. Services are provided at two drop-in centers, located in Harlem and the Lower East Side, and at two emergency shelters, located in Harlem and Midtown.
