Manhattan Community Board 10's April Executive Committee on behalf of the full board unanimously approved the following Letter of Support re: **Proposed M100 routing changes and associated curb regulation changes on Saint Nicholas Ave between 124th and 125th Streets.**

The Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) is proposing to change the southern last stop and layover of the M100 bus route, and for the NYC Department of Transportation (NYC DOT) to make signage and curb regulation changes.

The MTA has identified illegal parking causing buses to double park, impacting bus reliability, and ADA accessibility, and overall traffic congestion leading to 125th Street. In response, the MTA is proposing to relocate the last stop to the current M3 stop on the west side of the same block and to relocate the layover immediately across from the existing last stop and layover, on the south half of the west side of the block. The change must occur in collaboration with NYC DOT to relocate the existing *For Hire Vehicle* stand on the west curb back to its original east curb, replacing the current M100 layover stop.


In order to serve the proposed last stop and layover, the M100 routing would change so that it will go east on 125 Street, south on St. Nicholas Avenue to the last stop and layover, and then south on Manhattan Avenue, east on West 122 Street, north on St. Nicholas Avenue, and then west on 125th Street to the first northbound stop.

To ensure agency collaboration and timely notice to the community regarding these

changes, Manhattan Community Board 10 supports this proposal to improve bus operations, allow for better ADA accessibility for bus riders, and coordinate with the 125th Street train station.
