# **General Board Meeting**

Wednesday, February 7, 2018 – 6:00 PM Adam Clayton Powell, Jr. Harlem State Office Building 163 West 125<sup>th</sup> Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Art Gallery Honorable Chair Cicely Harris, Presiding
