Exterior Renovations to Land Use. The roof deck and the modifications to the fenestration of the rear façade are not visible from any public street or thoroughfare. The bulkhead is not visible from Terrace, between Sylvan Terrace and West 162nd Street, as well as from a portion of Roger Morris Park, albeit the Committee was informed that for LPC review purposes a park is not considered a On March 5, 2014 Richard Goodstein and Michael Hanson of NC2 Architecture LLP presented the West 162nd Street, the primary street onto which the Property faces. The bulkhead can be seen from West 161st Street and St. Nicholas and Amsterdam Avenues and from portions of Jumel public street or thoroughfare. The vantage points from which the bulkhead is visible do not impact the primary street façade of the Property or any properties in the historic district; and
