The Mayor's FY 2002 Executive Budget has proposed a 19% cut totaling \$20.55 million for the New York Public Library, \$17.6 for Branch Libraries and \$2.95 for Research

Libraries, and

Whereas:

Library service has significantly improved over the last decade through six-day service, expansion of the Connecting Libraries and Schools and Summer Reading programs.

introduction of broad access to technology, and capital improvements, and

Whereas:

If the 19% cut is enacted, devastating reductions will be made to days of service, the materials budget, CLASP, Summer Reading program, and all other library services, and

Whereas:

Northern Manhattan's Inwood Regional Library will soon reopen after a 2 year renovation project. The proposed cuts would mean the community would not have full access to the new facility as well as to the Fort Washington and Washington Heights branches for ESOL classes, book discussion groups, school related materials, Internet classes, and a

wide range of programs and story hours for children; therefore,

Be It Resolved:

That Community Board #12, Manhattan, urges the Mayor and the City Council to restore

the proposed 19% cut.
