Dear Ms. Pico:

The following resolution was passed by Community Board #12, Manhattan at its last General Meeting on May 22, 2001.

In the matter of an application submitted by Broadway & 166th LLC a/k/a Dallas BBQ Restaurant for a one-year license to occupy and use sidewalk space for the operation of an enclosed sidewalk café with 28 tables and 58 seats at 3956 Broadway in the Borough of Manhattan.

Whereas: Community Board 12, Manhattan held a Public Information Hearing on May 2, 2001 regarding the construction of an enclosed sidewalk café by Dallas BBQ located at 3956 Broadway at West 166th Street; and

Whereas: A representative of Dallas BBQ made a thorough presentation of their plans; and

Whereas: The proposed enclosed sidewalk will be located on the south side of West 166th Street, southeast corner of Broadway and West 166th Street and will extend 9 feet 7 inches, the maximum extension allowed by the Department of Transportation regulations; and

Whereas: The enclosed sidewalk café will accommodate 28 tables and 58 seats intended to hold large groups; and

Whereas: The community members in attendance expressed support for the restaurant and the sidewalk café; therefore

Be it

Resolved: That Community Board 12, Manhattan recommends approval of the application for an enclosed sidewalk café for a period of one year.

Dear Mayor Giuliani:

The following resolution was passed by Community Board #12, Manhattan at its general meeting on May 22, 2001:

- Whereas: The Mayor's FY 2002 Executive Budget has proposed a 19% cut totaling \$20.55 million for the New York Public Library, \$17.6 for Branch Libraries and \$2.95 for Research Libraries, and
- Whereas: Library service has significantly improved over the last decade through six-day service, expansion of the Connecting Libraries and Schools and Summer Reading programs, introduction of broad access to technology, and capital improvements, and
- Whereas: If the 19% cut is enacted, devastating reductions will be made to days of service, the materials budget, CLASP, Summer Reading program, and all other library services, and
- Whereas: Northern Manhattan's Inwood Regional Library will soon reopen after a 2 year renovation project. The proposed cuts would mean the community would not have full access to the new facility as well as to the Fort Washington and Washington Heights branches for ESOL classes, book discussion groups, school related materials, Internet classes, and a wide range of programs and story hours for children; therefore,
- Be It Resolved: That Community Board #12, Manhattan, urges the Mayor and the City Council to restore the proposed 19% cut.
