### Dear Chairman Markus:

Manhattan Community Board 12 passed the following resolution by a vote of 28-2-2 at our General Meeting on May 24, 2005:

Whereas: The housing crisis in New York City affects countless tenants, including the middle

class and the working poor, as well as the homeless; and

Whereas: There were 1,013,954 rent-stabilized apartments in New York City, 56,444 of which

were in Washington Heights-Inwood, as of 2002, according to the most recent Housing and Vacancy Survey conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, and

Whereas: The Rent Guidelines Board (RGB) annually approves rent increases for rent-

stabilized tenants to be paid upon lease renewals, and these rent increases are usually

higher than the increases its staff finds in landlords' operating costs; and

Whereas: The RGB voted on May 3 to approve preliminary guidelines between 2-4.5% for

one-year lease renewals and between 4-7% for two-year renewals; and

Whereas: According to the RGB's latest Income and Affordability Study, tenants' income in

real economic terms has been declining steadily, by 5% in 2002 and by another 1.5% in 2003 (the most recent data available), and the Community Service Society found that low-income New Yorkers are paying an average 57% of their income for rent;

and

Whereas: Landlords' average net operating income (the portion of revenue from rent remaining

after all operating and maintenance expenses are paid) was a very healthy 38% last year as determined by the RGB, which demonstrates that owning multiple buildings

is not a high-risk business in the current real estate market; now therefore

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## **Resolution Rent Guidelines Board**

### Be It Resolved

That

Community Board 12-Manhattan urges the Rent Guidelines Board to show fairness towards tenants this year, after years of overcompensating landlords, by not authorizing any additional rent increases for rent-stabilized tenants whose leases expire between October 1, 2005 and September 30, 2006; and

### Be It Further

Resolved That Community Board 12-Manhattan encourages the residents and the elected officials of this community to attend and testify at the upcoming hearings of the Rent Guidelines Board on June 14 and 16 as well as attend the meeting on June 21 when the final vote will be taken on the authorized rent increases for 2005-06.

We would appreciate your response to this resolution at your earliest possible convenience. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
