Whereas:

Florence and Herbert Irving began making major gifts totaling \$87.4 million to research and patient care at

Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center (CPMC) in the early 1980s; and

Whereas:

This support enabled CPMC to renovate facilities now called the Irving Center for Clinical Research to foster

multidisciplinary research on human diseases; and

Whereas:

The Irvings also sponsored the construction of new cancer treatment facilities in the 1990s that have been integrated with the cancer research programs as the Herbert Irving Comprehensive Cancer Center, which is

located in the Herbert Irving Pavilion on Ft. Washington Avenue at W. 165th Street; and

Whereas:

These treatment facilities have provided state-of-the art care for patients and supported community programs

such as the free mammogram program for uninsured women; and

Whereas:

New York-Presbyterian Hospital wishes to honor the Irvings for their extraordinary generosity in significant ways;

and

Whereas:

One of those ways would be to add their names to the street in front of the Irving Pavilion; therefore

Resolved:

That Community Board 12, Manhattan supports the request to add "Florence and Herbert Irving Way" to the

street signs on Ft. Washington Avenue from the north side of W. 165th Street to the south side of W. 168th Street.

Whereas:

James McAlary, 42, was a dedicated husband, father and friend whose life was cut short on September 11, 2001 at the World Trade Center, where he worked at the New York Mercantile Exchange as a successful trader; and

Whereas:

James McAlary was a loyal member of the Washington Heights-Inwood community. Born and reared on West 189th Street, he spent a considerable amount of his teenage years and adulthood in Inwood. As a teenager, he played baseball in Inwood Hill Park and as an adult played there with the Inwood Men's Softball League. While going to school, he worked at local businesses near Broadway and W. 207th Street, and after college, he went to work as a custodian at P.S. 132 and at P.S./i.S. 187 for more than 12 years. After his marriage to Jeanne McCutcheon in Good Shepherd Church, he and his family made their home for 10 years at 45 Park Terrace West at West 215th Street; and

Whereas:

Even after buying a home in the suburbs, he maintained his strong ties to Inwood and the Good Shepherd parish by often returning to visit family and friends; therefore

Whereas:

The Cloisters: The branch of The Metropolitan Museum of Art at Fort Tryon Park, is a New

York City Landmark; and

Whereas:

The Americans with Disabilities Act requires all public buildings to be accessible to the

Handicapped; and

Whereas:

The Cloisters proposes to modify the entrance to the site to comply with disability law while

conforming with its aesthetic design; and

Whereas:

The Cloisters and its design team explore returning the cobble stones for possible use in

other, appropriate projects in Community Board 12, Manhattan; and

Whereas:

These modifications will also improve accessibility for all who may have difficulty climbing

the 70 or so steps to the main floor; therefore

Be it resolved: That Community Board 12, Manhattan endorses the changes proposed by the Cloisters to

make the museum accessible to individuals with disabilities and the elderly as prescribed

by law.
