	location almost every night of the week. Arrest was made for operating
	location and transferring liquor from Soju to the barbershop
	<u>12/15/16</u> Soju was shut down for nuisance abatement and served stipulations due to violation of ABC law.
	The 34 <sup>th</sup> Precinct is concerned that it's not clear who is running the
	establishment. The current owner is very much involved with Soju
	restaurant, overcrowding and bottle service. The person that is being
	removed is not the same one that causes the concern.
	Therefore, the 34 <sup>th</sup> Precinct does not support a renewal of this
	establishment and is very concerned about who is really running this
	location.
<b>Community Comments</b>	MFU stated that there were many problems with this establishment. It is
	not clear when the establishment is scheduled for a disciplinary hearing
	with the SLA.

Notes	The licensee had been given \$5,000 and \$10,000 fines by the SLA and an
	additional \$2,000 by NYPD. Ancelismel Portalatin is a new president of
	the corporation and one of the corporate partners was removed.
	Portalatin is also taking the Alcohol Awareness and Training Certification.
	Due to financial difficulties, the third partner will be removed at a later
	date. Security company had been changed.
	At the last inspection, the restaurant received grade 'B' due to a few
	violations. Owner stated that the violations have been cured.
	NYS Senator Marisol stated that she is going to introduce legislation to
	pass the moratorium. Also stated that it is embarrassing that the NYPD
	has to spend time and resources on this when they should fight real crime
	and terrorism, crimes on the subway, etc. This is a neighborhood when
	we have people raising children and if an establishment is going to be
	responsible they cannot come and play games with us when they tell us
	that they make changes to corporate structure and in the following
	month they will continue to conduct their business as usual. Changes
	need to be made; we are wasting taxpayer money when we are going
	after the same establishment over and over again. We need a responsible
	establishment in our community.

	As far as the bus stop, the only clearance per DCA are for the enclosures
