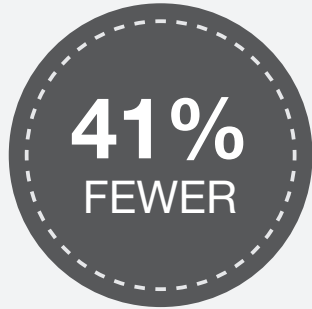


As of March 31, 2021, DSS-DHS provides shelter and services in **382 buildings**,

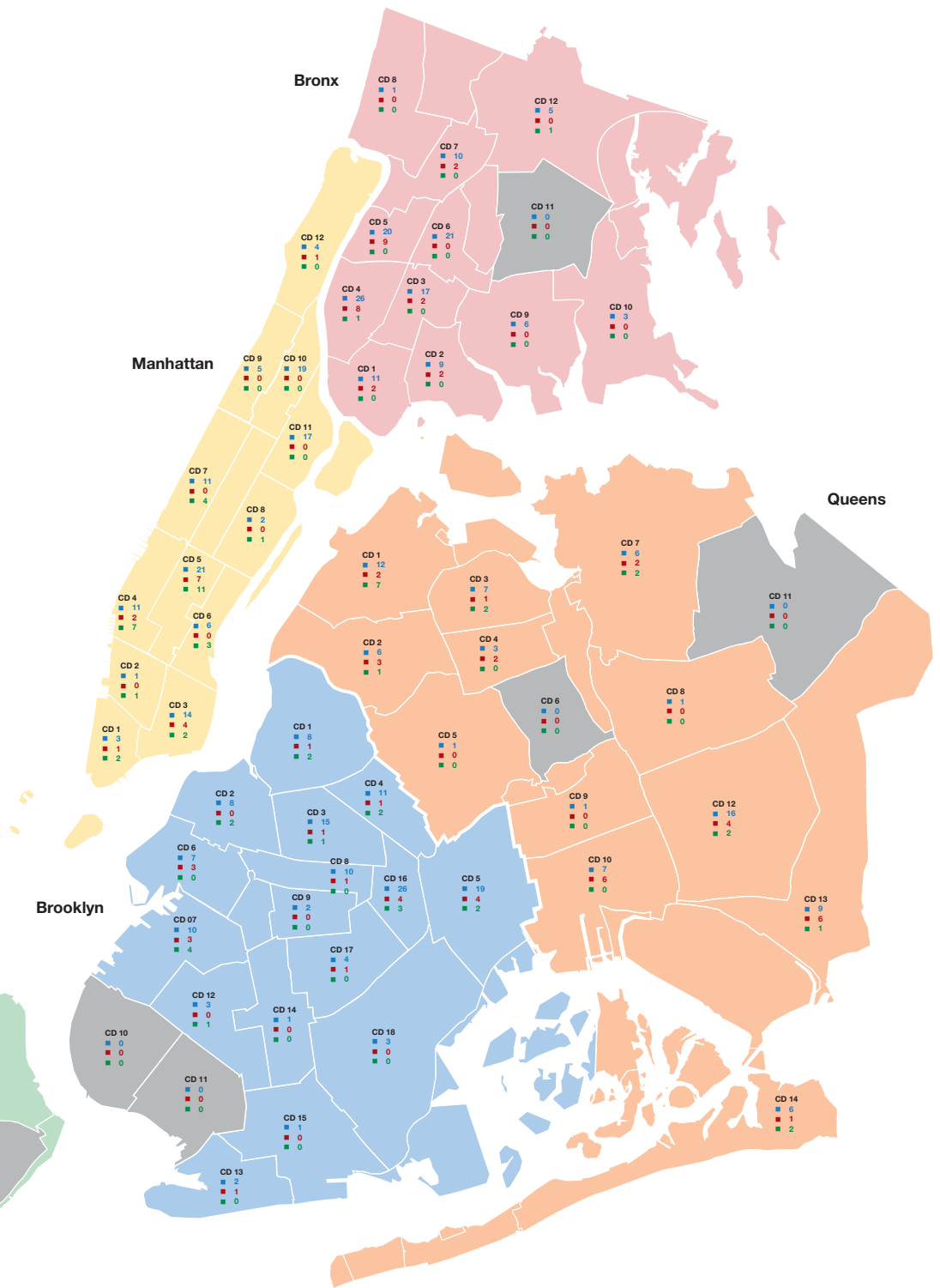


than the 647 buildings reported in Turning the Tide in February 2017.

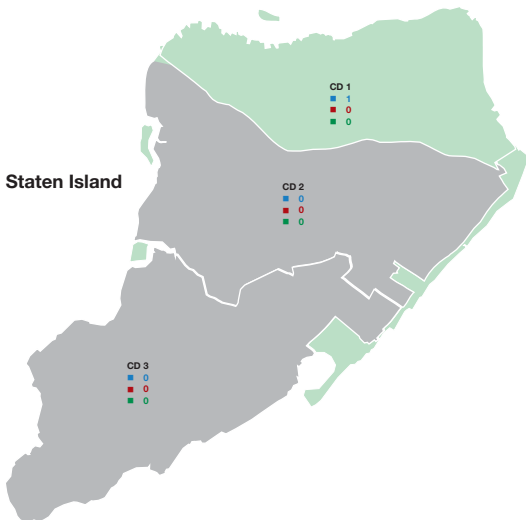
- All commercial hotel facilities and cluster buildings will be phased out as part of Turning the Tide as we work to ensure shelters are distributed equitably across the five boroughs, including in
- communities that do not currently have any shelters.

This will enable us to offer New Yorkers experiencing homelessness the opportunity to be sheltered in their home borough, closer to their support networks, as they get back on their feet.

In 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2020, our strategies to prevent and address homelessness helped to hold the NYC DHS shelter census essentially flat for four years in a row for the first time in over a decade at approximately 60,000. Today, the NYC DHS shelter census stands at less than 51,000.
