17 Barrow St is Landmark building located in Greenwich Village Historic District. It is located off 7th avenue and W4th st. Barrow street is is a small inconspicuous side street which makes it attractive and ideal for drug users, the mentally ill or unhoused. While I have sympathy for this underserved community it has brought dangerous activity and public health concerns to my doorstep. I live with my 18 month old daughter and often I have had to clean up human feces, and syringes used to inject drugs. Additionally, I personally witness people performing sex acts, as well as act out in a manic state. When asking people politely to leave they have threatened me and my daughter and I have to call the cops. This situation has worsened since Covid and it puts us all in a very dangerous situation. This is the last effort I can think of to help our situation.

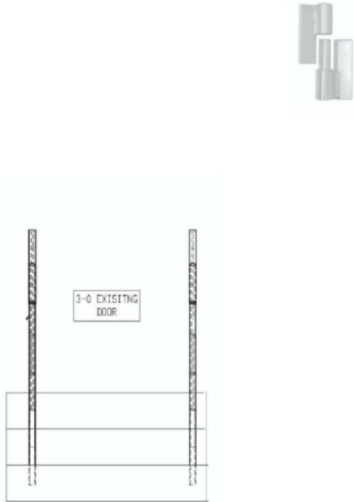
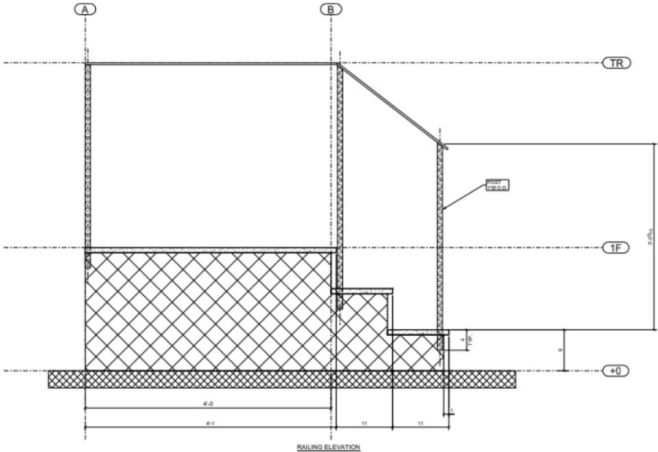

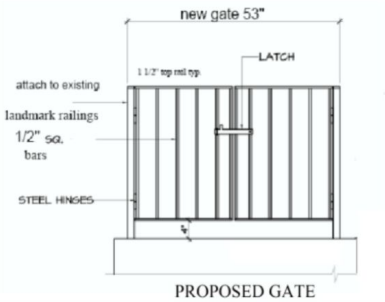
