Dear District Manager Mark Diller,

I am writing to inform you of the planned installation of two new Citi Bike stations in Manhattan Community Board 2. These stations are part of our Phase 3 infill effort to add bike share capacity to the system's core areas. Infill installations are expected to begin late Summer 2026.

Planned New Station Locations:

1. 6th Avenue from 9th Street to 10th Street (west side of roadbed)
2. Charlton Street from Hudson Street to Greenwich Street (north side of roadbed)

In December 2024, the New York City Department of Transportation (NYC DOT) and Lyft (the owner and operator of Citi Bike) announced additional growth of the Citi Bike system. This growth includes two distinct but related efforts: *expansion*, the process of bringing Citi Bike to new parts of New York City, and *infill*, the process of increasing capacity by adding stations and docks to the existing service area. As the system grows and ridership increases, infill helps the system function by improving the station network and increasing capacity in the highest ridership areas.

NYC DOT places stations in accordance with rigorous technical siting criteria, including street and sidewalk width, parking and truck loading, and proximity to street furniture and underground utilities, among others. This includes stations in commercial, recreational, and residential areas to ensure equitable access throughout the service area. DOT aims to balance the needs of our streets and sidewalks.
