22	This study covers only a small part of our district from W. 55 th	Street to W. 59 th
23	Street, from Eighth to Twelfth Avenues, however this area is th	
24	of trucks that enter our district to the north. It is home to the Ti	0
25	and the Hudson Hotel on W. 58th Street, a challenging combinat	e

31	<u>Truck Routing at W. 57th Street</u>	
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33	MCB4 is pleased that DOT will install signage on Ninth Avenue	and on W. 57 th Street
34	to direct truck traffic to use the Eleventh avenue entrance of th	e Lincoln tunnel. We
35	ask that DOT expedite the installation of those signs especially	as the bike lane is
36	being installed on Ninth Avenue.	
37	• In conjunction, we reiterate our long-standing request t	hat signs be installed
38	on W. 55 th Street and on Ninth Avenue barring truck tra	ffic from using W.
39	55 th Street.	
40	• We also reiterate our long standing request that Elevent	th Avenue be
41	converted one-way from W. 40 th to W. 57 th Streets and t	wo ways from W.
42	34 th to W. 40 th Streets.

44	<u>Pedestrian Safety</u>

46	•	MCB4 applauds the plan to install curb extensions at many intersections, in
40 47	•	particular at the southeast corner of W. 58 th Street and Ninth Avenue, to
48		shorten the north south crossing of this 5-lanes street.

	•	MCB4 reiterates its request that a split phase signal (which creates separate
50		times for pedestrian crossings and turning vehicles) be installed on 9 th
51		Avenue for cars turning east onto W. 58 th Street. Though W. 58 th Street is one
52		way, it is as wide as a two-way street for which this kind of treatment is
53		customary along bike lanes. The street between Eighth and NinthAvenues
54		includes several large residential buildings, an entryway to the Time Warner
55		Offices and Center, the Hudson Hotel (as well as its substantial nightlife
56		component), and several retail establishments. The combination of
57		substantial pedestrian traffic, truck deliveries and taxicabs from the usage
58 50		mandates a split phase signal. In addition a kindergarten is opening on the
59		northeast corner. Large number of children will be using this crossing.
60	•	We also request that left turn green phase from W. 57 th Street onto Ninth
61		Avenue be shifted from the beginning to the end of the green cycle to become
62		" lagging left arrow signal", a method that has been demonstrated to be safer
63	-	for pedestrians.
64	•	It should further include a red arrow whenever the green arrow is turned off,
65 66		this creating a "split phase". The June Midtown North Precinct report
66 67		indicated that crashes are increasing along the W. 57 th Street corridor and
68		residents have complained that the absence of a red left arrow signal on the westbound W_{1} 57th Street at the same time as the pedestrian "Walk" sign

75	•	MCB4 is pleased that DOT will install 120 feet of bus stop on the south side of
76	•	58 th Street West of the Hotel 6 entrance for four shuttle companies: 33WEA,
77		Corpexpress, Helena and ShuttleBusPlus. This long-standing request of CB4
78		will reduce the double parking, congestion and honking on the street.
79	•	Although it is five lanes wide in places, W. 58 th street has no markings. Its
80		width encourages drivers to speed while parkers feel free to double or triple
81		park. MCB4 requests that markings be installed to define clearly two lanes of
82		traffic and striping be installed on both sides to reduce double parking
83		occurrences. We request "No Double Parking" be installed along the second
84		lane in front of the Hudson Hotel.

86	We ar	preciate the community consultation process and the fact that DOT listened to
87	the community requests. We are anxious to see these improvements in place.
