Dear Mayor de Blasio,

New York has made tremendous progress through its various composting programs. The Waterfront, Parks, and Environment Committee of Manhattan Community Board 4 (MCB4) was alarmed to learn that all composting programs were being stopped due to the COVID-19 outbreak. By a vote of its Full Board of 48 in favor, 1 opposed, 0 abstentions, and 0 present not eligible, MCB4 requests that community compost locations be reopened and maintained.
