Breaking Ground CB 4 Report – September 2019

Catchment area:

- Breaking Ground's catchment area is 59th to 23rd Street, river to river. We conduct street outreach above ground, which includes the majority of the catchment area of Community Board 4.
- Breaking Ground conducts outreach in our catchment area 24/7.
- Downtown Goddard covers the rest of CB4 area that is south of BG, from 14th Street to 23rd Street.

311 Statistics:

- Community Calls: 92
 - During the day: 29
 - During evening, overnight or weekend: 63
- Calls resulted in clients not found: 47
- Calls resulted in individuals found that are known to team: 7
- Calls resulting in 911: 0

Canvassing efforts:

- Breaking Ground outreach team conducts street outreach in your catchment area daily and visits encampments, hotspots, and chronic clients with the hopes of getting them linked with services.
- There are 11 hotspots in this location that the team focuses on visiting every week.
- In addition, clients on caseload receive weekly visits from their case managers to create a plan for housing.

Joint Operations:

- The team continues to conduct weekly joint outreach with the Times Square Alliance every Wednesday morning.
- BG team conducted joint op with the 10th precinct – Dyer & 36th St and bi weekly JOs with MTN
- BG assisted with sanitation clean ups on Dyer and 36th (9.11; 9.16;9.18, 9.26) and on 56th & 12th on 9.20

Caseload Breakdown:

- On our caseload, we currently have 30 people who originate from the CB4 area:
 - Stabilization beds -11
 - Safe Havens – 9
 - Permanently housed –1
 - Street – 16
 - Whereabout - 3
 - Prospect/Pre-caseload clients – 6

Placement Statistics:

- In September 2019 – eight clients were added to the BG caseload.
- In September 2019 two clients accepted transitional placements.

Significant information/Areas of concern in the past 30 days:

- **51st btw 11th and WSH** – during the recent canvass the team didn't observe homeless activity or bedded down materials at above location
- **57th St & WSH** – there are two individuals staying at the location. Both on BG caseload, nor interested in services offered by the teams.
- **42nd b/ 8th and 9th Ave** –People tend to come and go frequently at this location, likely due to its close proximity to the PABT. Throughout the day, the entrance to the PABT on 42nd Street varies with its level of homeless activity. The area continues to be known as heavy drug activity spot. BG team conducts bi weekly Joint ops with MTN (Tuesday @ 9am and Friday @ 8pm)
- **40th and 8th Ave**- In the month of September 2019 the area continued to be active. Most clients can be observed sitting on the ground or holding the doors open of various businesses for donations. Many individuals that congregate at this location are refusing to engage with the team or report that they are not homeless.
- **38th between 8th and 9th Ave** – The area has decreased with homeless activity being observed at one particular location on the north side of the street. When the area has been canvassed, there have been between 0-10 individuals observed at this location. One person is on BG caseload. Many individuals engaged at this location are reporting they are not homeless.
- **8th Avenue between 38th and 39th** – The Holiday Inn courtyard has been active during the summer with patrons as well as a few people experiencing homelessness. There are larger groups in the late evening who refuse to engage with the team, reporting they are housed. However, it does appear that some of the activity had tapered off due to measures taken by hotel management to lessen access to non-hotel guests. BG will continue to monitor the area.
- **Chelsea Park** – The area remains a location the team canvasses daily. The teams encounter 2-6 homeless individuals in the vicinity during the day and 0-3 individuals in the nighttime.
- **8th Ave b/ 33rd and 34th Street** –This block is known to be active with panhandling and drug related activity. Activity at this location during month of September has slightly increased compared to the previous month, with up to three individuals engaged during evening hours.
- **8th Avenue between 35th and 36th Street**- Area remains active during the day time shift, mainly with individuals loitering in the area and utilizing the nearby McDonalds as a location to spend time inside during the day.
- **28th Street between 11th and WSH**- Team continues to canvass this location regularly as it's known to fluctuate in regards to activity
- **36th and Dyer** – Team continues to canvass this location daily. The location is very active with activity and encampments. BG team conducted joint op with the 10th PCT and assisted with multiple sanitation clean ups. Most of the clients at the location are BG caseload clients and refuse to accept placement.



Urban Pathways Outreach Summary

July, August and September 2019

Catchment area

- **Fashion BID** outreach team covers the North side of 35th Street – South side of 41st street from 5th to 9th avenues.
- **Flat Iron BID** outreach team covers the South side of 29th Street- North side of 21st Street from 6th to Park avenues.
- **Operation Alternative** – Port Authority Bus Terminal

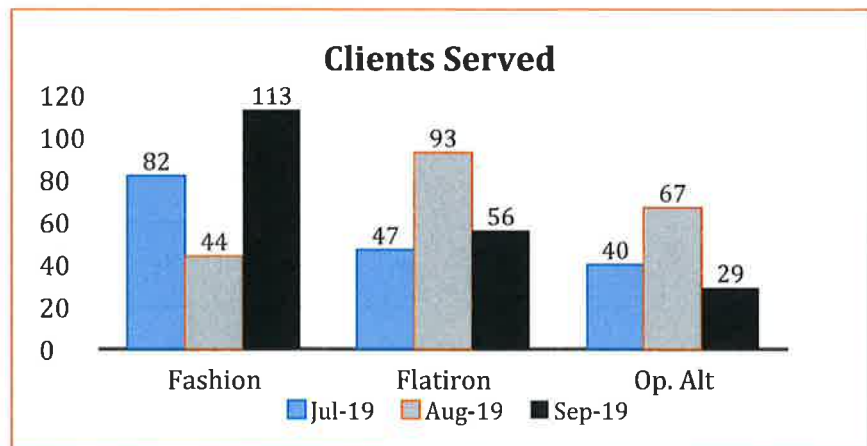
Canvassing efforts

- In the months of **July, August and September 2019**, the **Fashion** outreach team canvassed 35th Street between 5th and 9th Avenues during the hours of 8am- 4pm primarily, with 2 days of 6am-2pm and 2 days of 12am-8am shifts per month. Conducting 2 tours five days a week. The **Fashion** outreach team will normally engage 4 -13 homeless individuals throughout each shift, depending on the weather, time of day, and time of the month. During the first week of the month the numbers of engagement are lower, possibly due to government income (SSI/SSD).
- In the months of **July, August and September 2019**, the **Flat Iron** outreach team canvassed 28th Street- 29th Street between 6th & Park avenues primarily 7:30am- 3:30pm, with 2 days of 6am-2pm and 2 days of 12am-8am shifts per month. Conducting 2 tours five days a week. The **Flat Iron** outreach team will normally engage 4 -13 homeless individuals throughout each shift, depending on the weather, time of day, and time of the month. During the first week of the month the numbers of engagement are lower, possibly due to government income (SSI/SSD).
- In the months of **July, August and September 2019**, the **Operation Alternative** outreach teams canvassed the Port Authority Bus Terminal with the PAPD from the hours of 6am-2pm, and 4pm-2am, conducting 3 tours within each shift. The Operation Alternative outreach team will engage an average of **29-44** homeless individuals a month.

 - 49%-Fashion 28%-Flat Iron 24%-Op. Alt.
- **In August 2019** Urban Pathways outreach teams served **204** unique homeless individuals

 - o 33% - Flat Iron
 - o 22% - Op. Alt
- **In September 2019** Urban Pathways outreach teams engaged **198** unique homeless individuals
 - o 57% - Fashion
 - o 28% - Flat Iron
 - 22% - Op. Alt

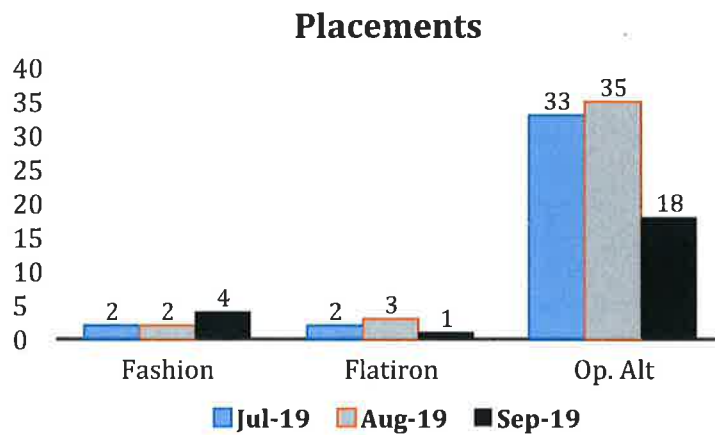




Placements

Urban Pathways outreach teams has placed **99** chronically homeless individuals within the Community Board 4 area during the months of July- September 2019.

- **Flatiron** –6 Transitional and Drop in Center placements
- **Fashion** - 7 Transitional and Drop in Placements; **1** Detox substance abuse Treatment Centers
- **Op. Alt.** – **86 Placements total**; **58** Transitional placements (DHS Shelter/ Detox hospitalization/Safe haven); **3** Direct family reunifications; **15** Drop in to family reunifications;**10** Drop in placements.
