## **Re: Bike Lane Improvements on 11th Avenue**

Dear Borough Commissioner Pincar,

Manhattan Community Board 4 (MCB4) is pleased that the NYC Department of Transportation (DOT) will complete the protected bike lane connections from West 38<sup>th</sup> and West 39<sup>th</sup> Streets and Eleventh Avenue to the Hudson River Greenway. However, we have serious concerns for the safety of cyclists on a section of Eleventh Avenue.

There are also safety concerns north of West 42<sup>nd</sup> Street and on West 54<sup>th</sup> Street and we ask DOT to address them as soon as possible. The following recommendations were voted on during MCB4's October 6<sup>th</sup> Full Board meeting by a vote of 43 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstaining, and 0 present but not eligible to vote.

The revised design addresses previous MCB4 objections, including:

- Two-way bike lane protected by Jersey barriers
  - on the south side of West 40<sup>th</sup> Street between Eleventh and Twelfth Avenues
  - $\circ$  on the west curb of 39<sup>th</sup> to 40<sup>th</sup> Street on Eleventh Avenue
- One-way bike lane protected by flexible bollards on the west curb of Eleventh Avenue
  - From West 40<sup>th</sup> to West 41<sup>st</sup> Street
  - From West 38<sup>th</sup> to West 39<sup>th</sup> Street
    o Left turn lanes in each direction
    o Pedestrian safety improvements to be installed in 2022
- Shared lane markings
  - along west curb West 41<sup>st</sup> to West 42<sup>nd</sup> Street

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We ask that you reconsider the shared lane markings and instead install a protected bike lane.

In addition, we have received numerous reports and videos of drivers using the Eleventh Avenue bike lane from West  $51^{st}$  to West  $42^{nd}$  Street to bypass traffic. They engage in this illegal activity at high speed, a menace for cyclists. It is urgent that installed protections make it difficult for drivers to enter the bike lane.

We have also received reports of auto dealerships systematically parking in the West 54<sup>th</sup> Street bike lane between Eleventh and Twelfth Avenues. Vertical bollards would help, similarly to those installed on West 39<sup>th</sup> Street.

We appreciate DOT's responsiveness to our concerns to-date and look for continuing efforts to increase street safety in our district.
