Re: Eighth Avenue Pedestrian Cyclist Fatality

Dear Commanding Officers and Borough Commissioner Pincar,

Manhattan Community Board 4 (MCB4) is saddened to learn that a pedestrian was recently killed in a hit and run crash with a cyclist on Eighth Avenue at West 21<sup>st</sup> Street. Although the information is incomplete, it appears the pedestrian was in the pedestrian crossing. The NYPD opened an investigation and is seeking information.

Every fatality<sup>1</sup> is heartbreaking because it could be avoided. But the observations of cyclists' behavior in our district make us fear injuries will increase: cyclists are now routinely using sidewalks even when a bike lane is present, and riding the wrong way is now the norm. With so

many families and seniors, these illegal practices that exploded during COVID need to be curtailed.

At its September 7<sup>th</sup> Full Board meeting, by a vote of 46 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstaining, and 0 present but not eligible, MCB4 asks the Department of Transportation (DOT) to use its toolkit to educate cyclists at problematic locations in our district. Infrastructure must continue to be upgraded faster and more systematically to protect in priority the most vulnerable street users.

We are also asking NYPD to increase its enforcement of no cycling on the sidewalk, and no cycling the wrong way. We expect this enforcement to be doled out equitably to all cyclists who break the law. Indeed, this enforcement should not be exclusive to cyclists, but apply also to all drivers who do not heed the law and illegally block bike lanes and sidewalks.

With business returning and school reopening, it is critical that sidewalk space be dedicated to pedestrians -as is the law- and rules of the road be adhered to.
