Re: 550 West 20th Street Preservation Concerns

Dear Mr. Arnold:

We are deeply concerned that the exterior of 550 West 20th has been altered without legally-required oversight by the New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). Members of the community noticed that many of the building's terracotta elements had been removed and replaced in an apparently permanent manner with brickwork. When told of this, SHPO indicated that it had not been notified of the work as required by law. This amounts to a serious breach of accountability.¹

As noted in <u>CB4's February 12, 2019</u>, letter to Empire State Development:

"The building was declared landmark-eligible during the West Chelsea rezoning. Accordingly, the preservation of the historic elements of the building, reflecting its history as the Seamen's House YMCA as well as the Bayview Correctional Facility, was a critically important goal for us during the lengthy discussions and zoning work."

Most of the polychrome terra-cotta elements that were removed are a particularly important, visually crowning part of the building, which was designed by notable architects Shreve, Lamb & Harmon at about the same time that the firm designed the Empire State Building.

We understand that the Office of General Services (OGS) has since told SHPO that the removed terra-cotta elements had been stored for preservation and reinstallation by the building's future tenant in its reuse to supportive housing. The Community Board would like to know where these elements have been stored and expect to receive that information posthaste.

CB4 requests a meeting with OGS and SHPO to view the removed elements firsthand and discuss how their restoration will be ensured, and how the overall renovation will proceed under SHPO oversight.
