Re: Restarting Participating Agency Community Consultations

Manhattan Community Board 4 was pleased to hear that in 2023 the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (PANYNJ) will take the first step in its program to build the new bus terminal. Namely, it will start the construction of two platforms over Dyer Avenue between W37th Street and W39th Streets. It seems that contract solicitation will start as early as the first quarter of 2023.<sup>1</sup>

We understand that these two platforms would allow the creation of bus gates and bus staging areas while the old bus terminal is demolished and the new constructed. Once the bus terminal project is completed, PANYNJ will convert these spaces to parks.

For the last two and half years, the PANYNJ and MCB4, a Participating Agency in the PABT Redevelopment Project, had been meeting on a regular schedule to review the planning of this critically important transportation project and its impact on our community. We exchanged ideas, offered suggestions on ways we saw how the project could be revised to better fit into Hell's Kitchen and enhance the pedestrians' experience, and together discussed possible efforts to mitigate the project's negative effects. It was an effective and fruitful process, but it has been stopped at the request of the PANYNJ, which is unfortunate. We have been told this pause is only temporary, but it has lasted almost six months. More recently, MCB4 was pleased to have been contacted by PANYNJ's Participating Agency engagement team to schedule a meeting on February 8<sup>th</sup>. MCB4 looks forward to return to meeting with the bus terminal redevelopment team on a regular basis.

Given the public announcement of the platform construction, the first meeting should focus on that work and the timeline. Construction brings a lot of questions, and mitigation efforts often fall short, so we are eager to begin this conversation.
