



A Day With a U.K. Ambulance: Painful Waits, Crowded Hospitals

WREXHAM, Wales — Rachel
Parry and Wayne Jones, two
paramedics with the Wrexham
Ambulance Service, pulled up to a
hospital in northern Wales with a
patient just after 10 one morning
in early December.

That's when their wait began.

It would be 4:30 p.m. before
their patient, a47-year-old woman
with agonizing back pain and
numbress in both legs, would be
handed over to the emergency
room of Wrexham Maelor Hospicolor of Wrexham Maelor Hospital. It was more than 12 hours
since she had first called 999, the

— and so common — the two

"We start with an apology now,"


