## Re: Mitigation of Lincoln Tunnel congestion on Ninth Avenue

Dear Borough Commissioner Pincar & President Cotton,

Manhattan Community Board 4 (MCB4), at its Full Board meeting on May 3<sup>rd</sup> voted by 38 in favor, 0 opposed, 0 abstaining, and 0 present but not eligible, reiterates its August 16, 2021<sup>1</sup> and April 19, 2022<sup>2</sup> requests that drastic measures be taken immediately to alleviate the extraordinary traffic congestion and air quality degradation due to the considerable increase in Lincoln Tunnel bound vehicular volume since the beginning of the COVID recovery period. Every day, seven days a week for a total of eight hours, mornings and evenings, the community endures gridlock, honking, and unhealthy air quality. Businesses are directly affected as the situation is an order of magnitude worse than pre-COVID conditions.

- We support the Hudson Yards / Hell's Kitchen Alliance BID (HYHK) and reiterate our request that the Department of Transportation (DOT) and Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (PA) work together to test the viability of a solution which the Port Authority proposed: reduce volume and merging conflicts at ramp C by closing Dyer Avenue North entrances from West 34<sup>th</sup> to West 36<sup>th</sup> Streets. This traffic would be redirected to the Eleventh Avenue entrance northbound.
- We also repeat our request that the green light cycle be reduced on Ninth Avenue at the intersections with West 37<sup>th</sup>, West 38<sup>th</sup> and West 39<sup>th</sup> Streets. Green light cycle should also be reduced on West 37<sup>th</sup>, West 38<sup>th</sup> and West 39<sup>th</sup> Streets at the intersections with Ninth Avenue.

We'd like to recognize and thank DOT for their serious efforts to date to resolve this issue: a noturn sign into Ramp C every day, from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. was installed. This is intended to direct to Eleventh Avenue the cars arriving from east of West 37<sup>th</sup> Street and free up capacity to allow the center tube of the Lincoln Tunnel to absorb the volumes of Ninth Avenue queues. This sign must be enforced by traffic agents. HYHK committed to fund one agent at this intersection daily.

After a few weeks of operation, it has become clear that this approach is not sustainable and has some unintended consequences:

- Preventing cars from turning in the two-lane ramp requires two agents. This is twice the expected cost and a significant financial burden on the BID.
- The traffic is so intense and hectic that some agents refuse to step in the way. Even when NYPD traffic agents are on site, they are reluctant to enforce the sign.
- In some instances, the West 37<sup>th</sup> Street queue of cars being redirected west of Ninth overflows, blocking the entrance to Ramp C.

As you know, congestion pricing will only help reduce tunnel congestion if the Lincoln Tunnel surcharge is significant enough to reduce the number of vehicles coming into and leaving Manhattan.

Addressing this issue is critical since the new bus terminal will add bus volumes to the Tunnel in the evening periods, causing further delays. Such delays result in prolonged idling and honking, diminishing both our air quality and our peaceable enjoyment.

We cannot emphasize enough the heavy burden that unmanaged Lincoln Tunnel traffic puts on our residents and businesses. We appreciate your help in addressing this issue.
