Manhattan Community Board No. 4 strongly opposes the granting of the applied-for permit to the above referenced organization. The Board considers the proposed location totally unsuited for street fair use. In addition to bus service disruption, closing 9th Avenue between 23rd and 34th Streets would have a serious impact on traffic exiting from the Lincoln Tunnel and block trucks servicing the Main Post Office and the nearby distribution facility. The traffic build-up above 34th Street would also have an impact on vehicles trying to reach the tunnel entrance, and possibly even affect the Port Authority Bus Terminal.

The Committee's negative recommendation was endorsed by the entire full Board at its meeting on June 5, 2002.
