Dear Mr. McKeon:

At its June 11, 2002 meeting, the Business Licenses & Permits Committee of Manhattan Community Board No. 4 voted unanimously to deny the application of 191 7th Avenue Restaurant Corporation, d/b/a Mango's for a new on-premises liquor license.

The applicant, who also owns and operates La Belle Vie, Tello's, Cuba Libre and Mare, has cobbled together several storefronts at 191 Seventh Avenue to create a 2400 square-foot restaurant space. According to the applicant, he does not know the configuration, kitchen location, occupancy, or whether it will be one restaurant or two restaurants with one kitchen.

No plan, as of yet, (i.e. architectural, mechanical, or otherwise) has been filed with the Department of Buildings or is even in existence. The owner will take a year to work these out.

In addition, the owner states that he has already filed for his liquor license with the State Liquor Authority without waiting for a response from the Committee or the community.

With no information about this project, no community response, and the applicant's flagrant disregard for the mandated approval process, we urge the State Liquor Authority to deny this liquor license application.
