**Re: Himalayan Museum on Barney's site**

Dear Ms. Schubert:

Manhattan Community Board No. 4 thanks you and the Rubin Cultural Trust for your presentation on the proposed Himalayan Museum to the Chelsea Preservation and Planning Committee in May. We regret that circumstances prevented your architects from giving a more complete presentation at the June meeting of the Committee, and are looking forward to your full presentation of all aspects of the project at the full Board meeting on July 24<sup>th</sup>.

The Board welcomes this proposal for a large portion of the former Barney's store at the southeast corner of Seventh Avenue and 17<sup>th</sup> Street. It believes this is an appropriate reuse of these now vacant linked buildings that will enrich the quality of life in the area and will reinforce and extend the character of Chelsea as an arts district. We hope the Trust will be able to locate appropriate uses in the portions of the buildings that it will not be using itself.

The Board is glad that the Trust has taken over the maintenance of the much-abused planters on the Seventh Avenue side of the building, since they had deteriorated so badly that the Board had actually requested their removal. We have received your letter confirming this intention and are looking forward to seeing them restored to their original attractiveness. We note the concern of the 17<sup>th</sup> Street Block Association, between Sixth and Seventh avenues, about this issue, as shown by the presence of their leadership at your first presentation to the Chelsea Committee and we are glad to see that the Block Association joins us in supporting both the restoration of the planters and your reuse of the building as a museum.
