**Dear Commissioner Forgione** 

Manhattan Community Board 4 supports the streetscape improvements proposed by the Chelsea Improvement Company (CIC), based on their agreement to incorporate some suggested modifications. The streetscape is proposed for an area roughly from 15th to 16th Street west of Eighth Avenue and along 9th Avenue to 14th Street.

Their proposal, as presented to the CB 4 Transportation Committee on July 16th 2008, is to install 3 news boxes, 19 bike racks, 6 benches, and 28 new curb corners. Much of this proposed street furniture upgrades existing furniture, especially the bike racks and curb cuts. The news boxes, too, should largely replace the hodgepodge of plastic boxes currently cluttering many corners of this area, the subject of many neighborhood complaints. We find that the design has been thoughtfully done, with a steel and black motif that complements trash cans already placed in the area. The CIC intends to install two curb cuts wherever there is enough space at the street corners. We expect that all curb ramps will be equipped as required with detectible warning strips compliant with federal standards, and that furniture will be compliant with the latest ADA guidelines for vision-impaired pedestrians including reflective stripes.

We recommend the following modifications:

- No benches or furniture should be installed in front of service doors (to preserve convenience of deliveries and fire department access).
- The proposed news box on 15th Street at the North West corner of 8th Avenue leaves only a 5.9 foot walk lane. This is insufficient, especially since it is near a subway exit. We request that it be located on the Avenue around the corner.
- On 9th Avenue at the North West corner with 14th Street, the Apple store attracts large volumes of pedestrian and taxi drop-off traffic. Adding a news box there does not seem advisable. One option is to locate the news box on 14th Street, where the sidewalk is wider. The plaza is another possible location, particularly since it has substantial seating.
- To conform with DOT guidelines bike racks should be installed so that the bikes are parked parallel to the curb. Only 10th Avenue and 14th Street sidewalks are wide enough to accommodate perpendicular parking.
- To dedicate most of the sidewalk space to pedestrians, rather than bike parking, and to discourage biking on sidewalks, we strongly recommend that, where feasible, bike racks be installed on median islands rather than on sidewalks. A good example is the

South East corner of 9th Avenue and 16th Street where an island is in place for the bike lane. Another example is the North West corner of 8th Avenue at 15th Street, if a bike lane is ever implemented there. Converting a car parking space to bike parking might also be preferable to bike parking on the sidewalk of Avenues.

Community Board 4 appreciates the CIC efforts to outreach to the local block associations and gain their support and to work closely with the Community Board. We support the proposed streetscape improvements with the modifications above.
