In recent weeks, we have heard from numerous residents complaining that the volume of buses on residential streets, particularly W26th Street between 8th and 10th Avenues, has increased significantly. Although they are not alone, the company Big Bus is reported as being the main culprit.

W26th Street has a playground, a school and a recreation center used by many seniors. Commercial bus traffic on such a busy residential street is putting all these parents, children and seniors in danger.

We would appreciate a focused enforcement effort on West 26th Street between 8th and 10th Avenue to deter buses from using this route.
