Re: Improved Response time for Engine 34 Ladder 21 Fire Station

Dear Borough Commissioner Forgione,

Manhattan Community Board 4 supports The Fire Department of New York's (FDNY) request to the Department of Transportation (DOT) to implement measures to reduce the impact of gridlock on this station's response time.

This station is located on 38<sup>th</sup> Street between 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Avenues. The 38<sup>th</sup> Street and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue intersection is one of the ten most gridlocked in Manhattan, per a 2006 Manhattan Borough President's study. The 37<sup>th</sup> Street and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue intersection is chronically gridlocked, except when a police officer is posted there (some days during peak hours).

When responding to an emergency occurring south of the Station, the fire trucks of Engine 34 Ladder 21 get caught in the gridlocked traffic going east on 38<sup>th</sup> Street at the crossing of 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue, and then on 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue going south at 37<sup>th</sup> Street. When responding to an emergency occurring north of the station, the vehicles have to follow this same route to circle back to Tenth Avenue.

Manhattan Community Board 4 requests that the DOT apply techniques already proven at other fire stations to mitigate this fire safety issue in the short term:

- 1) A contra lane on 38<sup>th</sup> Street, between the station and 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue, so that northbound fire trucks can avoid a long roundabout through congested intersections. There is such a contra lane for Rescue Company 1, on 43<sup>rd</sup> Street between Tenth and Eleventh Avenues.
- 2) A remote traffic light controller that the station or Headquarters can activate at departure time, to turn the lights green on (1)38<sup>th</sup> Street, where it intersects with 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue and (2)on 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue where it intersects with 37<sup>th</sup> Street. Other fire stations in New York City are equipped with such a remote control.

These changes will improve this station's response time, the safety of the community and the quality of life of the residents around these intersections.

We appreciate your help in addressing this serious safety concern.
